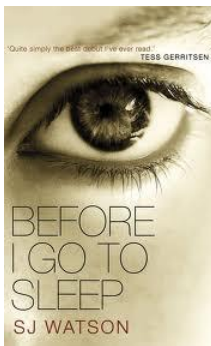
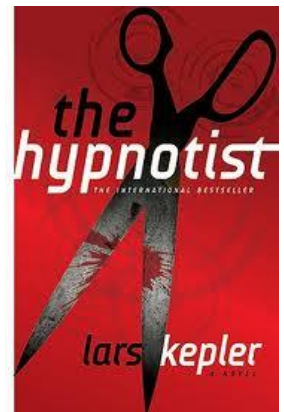


Lupton, Rosemary. *Sister: a novel.*
